

SELF GUIDED RIDE SUGGESTIONS

Gambling at WinStar Casino Resort.

The WinStar is approximately 65 miles to the north of the Convention Center (about one hour drive/ride). It is the largest casino in the USA. As the map indicates we suggest you take Highway 114 west to interstate 35W. There is a lot of construction on Interstate 35E from Loop 635 all the way through Louisville. Once you go over the Red River take Exit 1 and you cannot miss it. The casino has a number of different facades depicting the many different styles located around the casino floor. If this is your first visit to the casino please remember what your entrance looks like once you enter the casino. This place is sooo big you can easily lose track of where you are and you can loose a lot of time when you decide to leave trying to find your ride. If you win big spend your winning in Texas. WinStar World Casino and Resort is a hotel and casino located near the Oklahoma–Texas state line, 1 mile north of the Red River, at Exit 1 off Interstate 35 and WinStar Boulevard. The casino opened as the WinStar Casino in 2004, and was expanded (with a 395-room hotel tower) and renamed the WinStar World Casino in 2009, with its 519,000 square feet of casino floor making it the largest casino in the state of Oklahoma. In August 2013, WinStar Resorts completed a major expansion project, which added a new 1000-room second hotel tower that was divided into two phases; this also added a new casino that is attached to the tower. As a result of the completion of this expansion, the casino overtook Foxwoods Resort Casino to become **the largest casino in the United States** based on gaming floor space. WinStar has over 7,400 electronic games, 46 table poker rooms, 99 total table games, Racer's off-track betting, High Limit Room, keno, and bingo.

WinStar World Casino attracts many people from the North Texas region as well as Oklahoma residents. The casino's 3,500 seat Global Event Center has been home to some popular entertainment attractions including Jay Leno, Vince Gill, Adam Lambert, ZZ Top, Maroon 5, Kid Rock, Tony Bennett, and Davy Jones, who gave his final concert at WinStar on February 19, 2012
